These workshops are offered through the Citizen Science Program for stream monitoring volunteers but are open to anyone interested in learning more about aquatic bugs. Currently most citizen stream monitors identify bugs to order (e.g. mayfly, dragonfly, stonefly). Participation in these workshops will enable citizens to ID bugs to family level (e.g. type of mayfly, dragonfly, or stonefly) and will provide data results that are more similar to those obtained by DNR. Basic knowledge of streams helpful but not required. 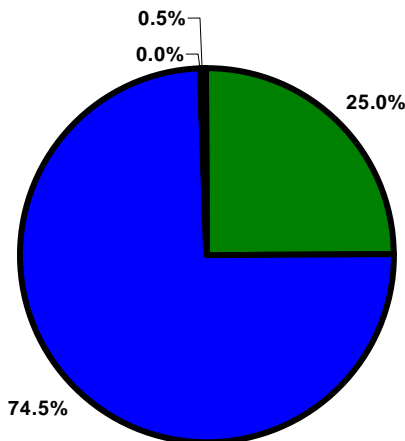
Types of animals observed, Wisconsin NatureMapping, October 2006
