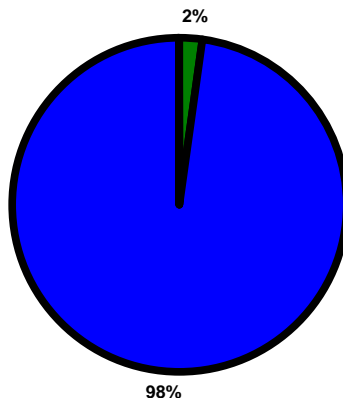
## Types of animals observed, Wisconsin NatureMapping, January 2007
