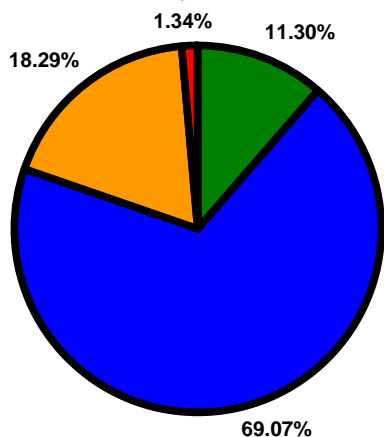
**June 7, July 17, August 22 – NatureMapping Trainings**
