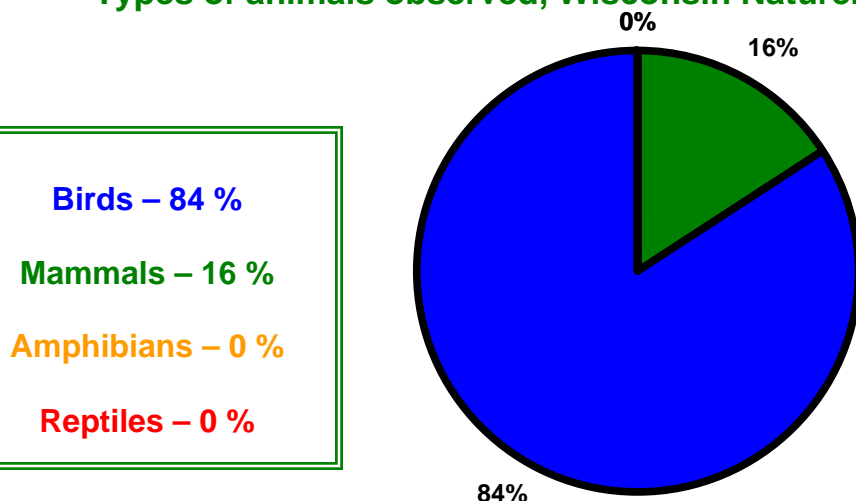
### Holiday Crafting for Kids – Saturday, Nov. 17, 10:30-noon.

### November Phenology courtesy of EEK!

Watch for whooping cranes, swans, hawks, Canada geese, and cedar waxwings to head south. Tundra swans are one of the latest waterfowl to migrate. Watch for them along the Mississippi river early in November. Dark-eyed juncos will begin to arrive. White-tailed deer are in rut and snowshoe hares will change their brown coats to thicker, white ones. Slugs and snails will burrow into moist marsh soil for the winter. Fish, such as cisco, coho salmon, and brown trout migrate upstream. Black bears will also begin to den this month.
